

Treatment

Citizen monitoring (encouraged by responsiveness, *blinded* to KCCA)

<u>Assignment</u>


Complete randomization

<u>Sample</u>

200 zones × 50 reporters (some overlap with P1/2)


<u>Outcome</u> Delivery of waste services

Measurement: 800 waste piles of community concern




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Map of Waste Piles



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
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
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
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


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Consistency of Reports on Service Quality, Treated Zones



Summary of findings

- Citizen reporting had no significant impact on the management or clean-up of informal waste piles
- Citizen reporting perceived to be too inconsistent for use in management of waste
- High rates of engagement by citizens (10-15%), but without results this will likely fall
- Consider critically the capacities that are needed to process and respond to information

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
