The role

Reporting to the Director of Admissions, the postholders will assess application files for our Master of Public Policy (MPP) programme. Applications are assessed holistically and contextually according to three key selection criteria: a) academic excellence, b) commitment to public service, and c) evidence of leadership and impact. At least two people will assess each file, with collated comments and scores reviewed by the Director of Admissions and/or a Senior Admissions Advisor.

Each Academic Admissions Assessor will be expected to complete up to 200 hours of assessment, depending on the number of applications received and reviewers available. Introductory training and group assessment sessions will take place from November 2023 onwards, with assessment taking place from then until final decisions are communicated in early March 2024. The deadline for MPP applications is 5 January 2024 and peak workloads for our academic admissions assessors will be expected to fall between 8 January and 23 February 2024.









Responsibilities

- Complete in-house training on the MPP admissions process and selection criteria, involving group assessment work from November until mid-December 2024.
- Assess MPP application files independently, according to provided criteria and guidance, during the peak period of assessment in January and February 2024.
 Assessment of applications can be carried out at any location.
- Provide advice to other assessors in areas and/or regions of expertise.
- Assist in refining the MPP assessment process.

Selection criteria

Essential selection criteria

- An undergraduate degree.
- A post-graduate degree and/or significant applicable professional experience which links to public policy.
- Experience of academic teaching, marking and/or admissions in a University, or comparable context.
- Extensive availability during the peak admissions period of 8 January 2024 to 23 February 2024.
- Ability to independently manage time and workload to complete assessments as agreed with the Director of Admissions and/or Senior Admissions Advisor.
- Good team work and interpersonal skills.
- Exceptional judgment.

Desirable selection criteria

- A doctorate degree.
- Specialist knowledge of one or more areas relevant to public policy (e.g. philosophy, economics, political science, law, science).
- Specialist knowledge or experience of the education system of one or more regions of the world outside the UK.
