Addressing complex challenges demands collaboration beyond governments, but traditional approaches to contracts stifle real partnership working and fail to unlock meaningful change.

Our faculty have worked alongside public officials and understand their frustrations, in particular with contracts that are meant to deliver complex human services. In response, the Leading Cross-Sector Partnerships Programme sets out a different approach.

Blending theory with practical insights, the programme explores the dynamics of cross-sector partnerships through innovative case studies that demonstrate impact measurement and lasting societal change. Participants will develop tailored tools and frameworks to achieve positive outcomes and overcome the frustrations of short-term, transactional approaches, ensuring they meet the challenge of network governance.
