

Window on Another World

An art competition for Oxfordshire children

We're looking for some fabulous images to go on public display and we'd love your school to take part!

Something exciting is happening in Jericho, in the heart of Oxford. Oxford University Press (OUP) and Oxford University's new Blavatnik School of Government (BSG) are going to be neighbours. To celebrate, OUP and BSG are teaming up with Laing O'Rourke, the construction company for BSG's new building, to run a 'Window on Another World' art competition for Oxfordshire primary school children. Winners of the competition will see their artwork reproduced on the BSG site hoardings, alongside a bespoke illustration of the much-loved children's book characters, Winnie the Witch and her black cat Wilbur, created by Winnie's illustrator, Korky Paul. He has shown them gazing through real windows that allow passers-by to see the building site.

Ask your pupils to imagine that they could look through a window into another world. What would they see? Encourage them to set their imagination alight and capture in a picture their bright and exciting visions of another world. Perhaps they'll choose to draw an amazing underwater scene, or invent an awesome cityscape, or imagine a prehistoric world of dinosaurs, or a fabulous fairy-tale kingdom of knights and dragons!

Entries will be judged for the most imaginative, bright, and exciting visions of another world. Korky Paul, illustrator of the best-selling *Winnie the Witch* books, will lead the panel of judges.

The competition will be judged in two categories:

Reception to Year 2 (ages 4-7)

Years 3 to 6 (ages 7-11)

- ★ The winning pictures (up to 12 in total) will be displayed on the Blavatnik School of Government building site hoardings from January to June 2015.
- ★ All 12 winners will receive a selection of OUP books and a goody bag from Laing O'Rourke.
- ★ One top winner from each category will also receive £150 worth of OUP books or resources for their school and the overall competition winner will receive an iPad mini from the Blavatnik School of Government.

Additional information

- Entries should be made on an A4 sheet of white paper.
- Artwork can be created in felt tip pen, crayon, paint, or coloured pencil. Please no glue, staples, or three dimensional collage elements.
- Please do not include any lettering or words on artwork.
- Each entry must be clearly labelled on the back in block capitals with the child's name, age, year, and school.
