Seminar Leaders for Foundations Michaelmas 2026

Overview of role

The Blavatnik School of Government invites applications for multiple Seminar Leader positions within the teaching team of the Foundations core course within the [Master of Public Policy](#) (MPP) in Michaelmas Term 2026.

Foundations is a compulsory subject for all MPP students. It aims to provide students a foundation in political philosophy for the purposes of public policy. It introduces students to theories of justice, feminism, authority, democracy, and equality, and focuses on applied topics such as immigration, post-colonial justice, ethics in public life, protest and revolution, and war.

As a Seminar Leader, you will have the opportunity to lead seminars, attend lectures and team meetings, and assess student work.

This is a unique opportunity for postdoctoral researchers, college lecturers, and late-stage doctoral students to gain valuable teaching experience at a graduate level and in a seminar, rather than tutorial, format.

You will be required to undertake the [Social Sciences Division Introduction to Learning and Teaching](#) if you have not already received equivalent training.

The Master in Public Policy (MPP)

The MPP aims to develop practitioners rather than academics. Our current MPP class consists of 140+ students from a very wide spread of countries and territories around the world. Our students, who are aged between 20 and 49 years old, have all been selected because of their outstanding academic achievements, their proven commitment to public service, and their capacity to show leadership and have real world impact. Students come from a range of different academic and socio-economic backgrounds and come with different levels of policy experience and exposure. The role

You will join the Foundations teaching team:

- Dr [Eniolá Ànúolúwapó Sóyemí](#) (course convenor)

Duties:

- Act as seminar leader for four seminar groups, holding 75-minute long weekly seminars with these seminar groups. Seminars are currently held on Wednesdays to cover the relevant content and material of each week.

This will require you to:

- Attend weekly lectures (currently held on Tuesdays)
- Read core material
- Attend weekly working lunch meetings.
- Convene 90-minute student drop-in sessions at least twice during the term.
- Mark and provide detailed feedback on formative assignments for each seminar student.
- Provide written feedback on each seminar student at the end of Michaelmas term.
- The role will require you to be present for teaching and administrative duties in Oxford on relevant days throughout the Michealmas teaching term.

Hours:

Seminar Leaders can expect to devote approximately 160 hours throughout the term, however please note hours may vary from week to week.

Selection criteria

- Experience of research in political philosophy, political theory, or related fields.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills.
- A systematic, thorough, and well-organised approach to work.
- A committed and collaborative team player.
- Relevant previous teaching experience.

Pay rate

Payment will be at the rate of £18.80 per hour (Grade 6.1), plus rolled-up holiday pay of 12.07% for each hour worked.

We welcome applications from those currently based in the UK, or overseas and who plan to be in Oxford from October 2026 for the duration of the Michaelmas term.

Please note that you must have the right to work in the UK at the time of teaching.

The closing date for applications is **12 noon (UK time) on Thursday 18 June 2026**.

We expect to hold online interviews at the end of June.
